Since 1 last wrote in March, Danie has had a number of mishaps that have required some degree of medical attention. First, she underwent minor "surgery" in April to free up a frozen right shoulder. It seems that she tripped, fell and jammed the shoulder early this year and didn't realize how badly it was hurt. Over time, she had been cautious about moving the shoulder and scar tissue developed in the shoulder joint. The surgery involved the injection of cortisone into the joint and a manipulation of the shoulder by a physical therapist. Danie was anesthetized for the procedure, but was told when she awoke that the therapist heard four loud "pops" coming from the shoulder during the manipulation. After several weeks of physical therapy, she regained most of the original range of movement in the joint.
